The most important instruction is no flunking the test and go to school the next day. The next step would be look over all the questions before starting, at least two or more times until you completely understand what the question is asking you to do. If the test is based on multiple choice questions, cross out the choices that don't make sense. Use the extra time to check over your answers to see if there right or if you think they're wrong. Those are the steps to scoring a sucessful test.

Some errors may exist (e.g., incorrect spelling of "*succesful*"; one overly long sentence). Response demonstrates control of expected conventions.
